Did Easter Change Anything?

It doesn't feel like Easter changed anything.

Death didn't end simply because it was Easter. Many people spent recent weekends burying loved ones who died from old age, terrorist attacks, heroin overdose, illness, suicides, and car accidents.

Troubles didn't magically disappear either. Bills continue to mount, couples are still getting divorced, teens are trying to release their pain by cutting, addictions are being fed, depression is darkening.

Maybe, like Mary in the garden on Easter morning, you find yourself crying because you can't seem to find the Savior. Instead of rejoicing and saying, "He is risen, indeed!" you might want to cry (like King David and Jesus), "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" You want to ask the God who inhabits the whole earth, "Where are you?"

Like Mary standing in the garden, let Jesus wipe your tears away and hear him call you by name. Even though your situation might not change because it was Easter, because of Easter, you are changed. Your Jesus willingly stood between you and the wrath of God and promised that it is finished. By rising from the dead, he changed your status from dead to alive, from slave of Satan to heir of the Father.

Still, because we are not yet in heaven, how can we live with Easter peace in this world when it still feels like Good Friday?

1. **Adjust your expectations.** Jesus tells us that in this world we will have trouble. So why are we surprised every single time we have trouble? A man named Job lost everything all in one day—his whole livelihood, his wealth, and all ten children—and yet he asked, "Shall we accept good from God, and not trouble?" (Job 2:10).

2. **Take heart.** Jesus has overcome the world, so it is well with your soul. It may not seem like it right now, but the peace that Jesus gives does not come because you have no trouble. If it does, then you might need to ask if you are worshiping God or if you simply want to worship a god who does what you want. Your God knows what you need, and he will not fail you.

3. **Look ahead.** St. Augustine knew the truth that God has made us for himself and that our hearts are restless until they rest in him. Say the truth like Job did, "I know that my redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand on the earth. And after my skin has been destroyed, yet in my flesh I will see God; I myself will see him with my own eyes—I, and not another. How my heart yearns within me!" (Job 19:25-27).

(By the way, these are not meant to diminish the pain of real world struggles. By all means, please share your burdens with the people God has placed in your life and let them help you carry them. Also, find a trusted pastor for spiritual counseling and a mental health professional to support you through the trials you face.)

Do you need another reminder that God hasn't actually left you or forsaken you? Let yourself be reminded daily in his word, the Bible, that God is still near you, even when it doesn't feel as if he is answering your cries.
