Encouraging! That's the one I forgot!

A few weeks ago, in the middle of a sermon, I tried to recite seven faith practices that the ELCA, (that would be us!) is encouraging us to be faithful around. I only got to six, and could not, mid-sermon, recall the 7th - but it's an important one!

In 2000, the ELCA introduced a Faith Practices Initiative called, "Living the Faith – Call to Discipleship." From that program came the following

seven faith practices to guide our discipleship: invite, pray, study, worship, give, encourage and serve. These seven practices continue to be used by individuals and congregations as we strive to be followers of Christ. (These practices were not "new" in 2000, and they're not "old" now :)

If you look in your Bible for the words, "Fear not!" or "Do not be afraid!", you'll find that Jesus and many messengers of God open with these words. En-couraging (putting courage into, or giving courage to) is that same reminder.

Our world is a very scary place sometimes. And those are the things that get the biggest press, the most tweets, the biggest attention. But the persons who work together to serve a meal in love to the family of a beloved departed, those who quietly help others celebrate and worship, those who practice music or fix things, or talk about their faith in God to others, those who work with young children most of the summer to share God's love; these don't get the acclaim or press. But we can take courage in the presence of God seen in



all those things, and in Creation, and in Sabbath, and in having vocations of service that we get to live out. In all these things, we are reminded that God's care for us is shown, God's presence is real, God's work for us in serving our neighbor is clear.
