

Here I sit to write a new article for this month's newsletter. In just the matter of a week, what I sent to Angie just doesn't fit. What a whirlwind of information, change, and decision making we've had to deal with in the past week and it seems it's compounded by the day if not by the hour. I've talked with many people (keeping my social distance and mostly by phone), some who are dealing with the called for responses to COVID-19 in stride, and some who are finding everything a overwhelming. I know the extroverted

members of my family are bouncing off the walls, creatively finding ways to connect by phone or email. One was caught dancing his sillies out in the privacy of his own living room. I, and my fellow introverts, have been pretty content reading, taking walks, and becoming every comfortable in my easy chair. I am extremely thankful for video chats with my granddaughter. She doesn't say much at 4+ months, but it's just fun watching her stuff everything and anything (including her toes) into her mouth.

My hope is that you are all finding ways for you to survive in these crazy circumstances. I have to believe that what we are being told to do is really for the best. I was just listening to a program that described how some people are questioning if all this social distancing is helping or necessary. They say we're not seeing the results. And that's exactly the point. This is one of those situations where not seeing anything happen is the best result. I don't know if I explained that as well as I could, but hopefully you get the idea. We don't want people spreading this coronavirus, so we need to heed the recommendations given to us. So please bear with it and as so many have said, we'll get through this together. Sure we've witnessed some unfortunate behavior from a few who are acting out of fear. But there are even more examples of courage and selflessness that are emerging! I was asked to move my appointment to give platelets to next week to make room for the number of volunteers who were just showing up at the blood bank. I'm convinced we'll see even more of that in the days and weeks to come.



In my devotions this morning, two very appropriate verses were set before me. I often connect with what are called "Daily Text" out of The Moravian Church. Here's the website if you would like to check it out (www.moravian.org/daily_texts). It's just two verses and a prayer, but they are a good base to meditate on and maybe journal about. The two verses this morning were:

Leviticus 26:6

The Lord said, "I will grant peace in the land, and you shall lie down, and no one shall make you afraid."

Philippians 4:7

And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

I contemplated a while on what it meant for the peace of God to guard my heart and mind. Part of my journal conversation with God was that God not only guard my heart and mind, but that God would guide my heart and mind. I don't often listen as well as I'd like.

I hope you can find ways to let God speak to you. It might be through using a devotional tool like this or the ones available at the church. We can mail one out to you if need. Maybe this would be a good time to just take a book of the Bible and read a small portion at a time. We're in the year of Matthew so that would be one suggestion. The Gospel of John has been our focus the last few weeks and John is always a good read. Or maybe start with Philippians or one of the other shorter letters of Paul's. And maybe music is what will connect with you and bring you the peace and comfort needed.

As this time of separation continues, please do what is necessary to take care of yourself! Connect with one another and keep each other in your prayers. We are planning to continue to provide worship videos and bulletins for you to participate with (check out our website at www.tflutheran.org). I plan to also periodically connect with you via video chats.

Let me leave you with the prayer from the devotional I mentioned earlier: *Prince of peace, fill our hearts and souls with your heavenly peace.* May it lead to comfort, healing, and reconciliation as your peace permeates our lives, our relationships, and our communities. Amen.

Our cooker is busy this season especially with a record collection of 4,400 gallons of sap on March 18th!





We went GREEN this year with all plastic food safe buckets! 2,500 in all. And the sap is running well this spring.

Thank you to ALL who are coming out to help!

We are happy to introduce a new Maple Bucks We are nappy to introduce a new program: Maple Bucks! This program has been used by Peace Lutheran who we partner with in our Maple Syrup Ministry and is very successful! These Maple Bucks can be designated and used for any mission (Mission Trip, Youth Retreat, Youth Gathering, Bible

Camp) or used "outside the walls of the church" (Feed my Starving Children, Together with Friends, etc). This does not apply to only youth member; this program is for ALL church members that participate in the syrup ministry. Examples of participation: Selling syrup downtown, stacking wood, getting permission to tap, labeling bottles and collecting sap. Here's how it works: when you and/or your family participate, you earn maple bucks for your account.

- 1. Each time you collect sap, you earn \$25. If you have Mom and Dad come with you, that's an additional \$50 added to your account—\$75 TOTAL!!
- 2. Each time you work the maple syrup booth to sell syrup at an event or during the fall, you earn \$25 in Maple Bucks.
- 3. Each time you sell a bottle of syrup, 30% of the sale will be credited to your Maple Bucks account.

How can you use your Maple Bucks? Say you'd like to go on the Youth Winter Retreat; the Maple Bucks in your account would then be applied to the balance towards that trip. Another great option to use your Maple Bucks for: the ELCA 2021 Youth Gathering—start earning your way now during sapping season! Remember to sign in each time you sap to get your credit for that day. If you have questions, please ask Michelle Lynch or Don Hansen.

Council Meeting Minutes Church Council of First Evangelical Lutheran Church

March 8, 2020, 10:30am-1:00pm

- C. Pastor's Report-Pastor Dwight

Pastor Dwight reported that there is nothing new really. He wishes there was more time to organize things like, the stewardship task group, visitation volunteers, and other things that might help us now and into the future.

He is okay with the present contract until May but would like to discuss changes before it is renewed.

A motion (by Rose/seconded by Craig) was made to allow for more hours (as needed) for Pastor Dwight and to pay \$50 per service for the extra services during Lent. Any additional hours will be paid \$25 per hour. Motion carried.

D. Treasurer's Report – Becky

Our income for January and February is less than our budgeted needs. However, we never adjusted the budget after Pastor Mary Kay left, so we have money to meet our current expenses. Steeple fund as of February \$39,284.84

E. Steeple bids

All of the bids received are higher than the original bid from 2 years ago.

One bid was \$80,000 but the company couldn't do the work. They recommended Central Roofing.

Central Roofing's bid came in at \$55,500 for steel and \$62,800 copper. The original bid was from Central Roofing.

The council is looking into how we can pay. We will have a congregational meeting to discuss only the steeple repair on April 19, right after the service. More information will be provided at that meeting.

F. WiPoLu transitional meeting 2/27/2020- handout from synod

We are looking at forming a partnership with another congregation. Do we want to yoke with the WI churches or with a MN congregation? Right now the MiChiLu congregations have not expressed an interest in sharing a pastor. There are more rural churches in WI so they have a history of sharing pastors.

The council decided to continue to meet with WiPoLu as it has been informative to find out what other churches in our area are doing.

We will reach out to the MiChiLu congregations to see if any are interested in partnering with First at some point.




17 Days Old
