

We are in the very midst of the season of Epiphany. Epiphany is the season where we think about God being revealed to us in Jesus and how the Light of Christ not only shines on and in us, but how does that Jesus shine through us. Often we say to ourselves, "But I'm no star, I don't have anything much to say or I don't know how to be a light to others. If anything I'm a candle just struggling to stay lit." That may be true, but God amazingly uses both stars and candles to accomplish God's revealing work and word to the world.

One of my favorite stories comes from Mary Schramm's book Gifts of Grace. She tells this story about how her mother shared a simple gift.

My mother lives in an apartment in Seattle. She shares a common laundry with 30 other tenants. One day, while doing her laundry, she noticed an elderly man across the room putting his coins in the dryer. He had obviously been crying. My mother went over to him and said, "I've seen you in the building, but I don't know your name." She introduced herself and then said, "I noticed you've been crying. Is there anything I can do for you?"

The man wiped his eyes with the back of his hand. "Thank you, but no," he said. As more tears started to come he looked at her



and added, "Yes, there is something but I don't expect you'd want to do it. It is one year ago today that my wife died, and in all that time no one has put their arms around me and hugged me." With that my mother, Norwegian as she is, wrapped her arms around the stranger and both began to cry as they rocked in each other's arms.

When my mother told me the story, later, she did so with great embarrassment. "I don't know what got into me," she exclaimed. "What if someone had come into the laundry room and seen me with my arms around a stranger! But somehow it just seemed the right thing to do."

It was the right thing to do. It is exactly the thing God does for us. More and more I am discovering that the two issues we face is identity and being free/liberated from all that binds us. Do you know who you are in God's eyes? Can you hear God's voice claiming you, "You are my beloved, with you I am well pleased"? That in itself is liberating. But think of all the other things that we are bound to and that bind our world. What an opportunity we have to see for ourselves the freeing message of God's love for us in Christ and to use our simple gifts to make that good news know. For freedom Christ has set us free. (Galatians 5:1)







C. Pastor's report - Pastor Dwight

In addition to presiding over weekly church services and 2 Christmas Eve services, Pastor Dwight has met with Confirmation students periodically, made 5 Hospital visits, presided over 2 Funerals, attended meetings and organist interview and the monthly synod interim meeting.

Now that the holiday season is over he is wondering how to move forward.. How he can help make the transition to our next pastor? What our next pastor position will look like?

Possible next steps include:

- Meet again with Krista Lind
- Meet with Jerry Wahl
- Congregational survey or conversation with the council to determine what the congregation wants.
- Possible monthly coffee-time table conversations: who were we in the
 past, who are now, who do we want to be in the future.. We could
 consult the ministry site profile to see what questions there are so we
 know what questions to ask the congregation.

D. Treasurer's Report - Becky

We took in \$18,395.75. There were 5 Sundays in December and Christmas services helped with giving. Our income for the fiscal year (from July) to date is 60% of our budget. This does not include the steeple fund. Not having to pay regular pastor salary and benefits has helped our budget. Becky will move \$9000 (from our to gift last month) to savings. The tithed amount from that gift will allow us to give \$400 to the Samaritan fund, \$300 to Together with Friends and \$300 to the Synod.

Motion: Becky made the motion that the balance of the gift from the most recent funeral go into the kitchen fund once the lunch expenses are paid. Seconded by Rose. Motion carried.

Steeple fund \$32,014.84 This is before any memorials from Swenson funeral. Becky asked Don to contact roofing company in December but has not heard back.

He is looking for 3 bids. We will have to decide on the color of the tiles. The Fick family has money for the lighting of the steeple. Joe is going to talk to an electrician about the cost for lighting the steeple.

People are wondering about a plaque with names on it of people who have given a substantial amount to the steeple fund. We don't have a precedent of having a plaque listing donors. The dedication ceremony bulletin could have an insert that lists the people who gave large contributions. Wendy will check with Jerry to see if there's a list of people who gave money.

E. Stewardship - Wendy

Time and Talents Sheet- We haven't done this in a few years. Wendy would like it to be part of the stewardship campaign.

Stewardship- We need to form a committee that is not council members. The stewardship committee can decide what to do with the time and talent sheets. Pastor Dwight will help guide the stewardship committee. People have been reading the stewardship book. We plan to set up a date to discuss the book. Possibly during coffee after church.

Discipleship Lists- The lists were meant as a way to ensure all members were contacted at least a couple times a year. They are not so useful if people don't call everyone on the list. We need some sort of list to ensure that there are volunteers for the jobs on Sundays.

Coffee with Council- The council will meet with people to discuss <u>Ask, Thank, Tell</u> on February 2 after the service.

F. St. Paul Area Synod Toolkit for Congregational Leaders, Gloria Dei Lutheran, St. Paul, Feb.22, 8-2:30. Pastor Dwight, Craig and Wendy will go.

G. Other business

The council received a suggestion to purchase a new lightweight metal rack for storing folding tables and folding chairs. The janitor was consulted and he has been asked to provide the council with an inventory of the number of folding tables and chairs around the church, how heavy they are and how many locations around the church have chairs and/or tables stored in them.

H. Upcoming events

Worship at the Lodge, Sunday, January 19, 2:00, Craig, Pastor and Michelle will go. Meeting at Faith Lutheran Church, Balsam Lake, Sunday, January 19, 2:00- Wendy, Becky and Miriam will go

Game night – Saturday, January 18, 4-6

Ash Wednesday – February 26- We discussed continuing to have two services during lent. The morning service has not been well attended but it does serve people who don't like to go out in the evening. Maybe there are some people who could give rides. Maybe the morning service could be at the lodge because a couple of our members live there now and we are currently doing a book study there on Wednesday morning. Pastor will look at the materials and make a recommendation.

Intergenerational Sunday school- We discussed how to start an intergenerational Sunday school. We decided it would be best to offer activities for kids at a table in the fellowship room so the adults are in close proximity. One Sunday a month everyone would be involved in the activity. Becky, Pastor Dwight, Michelle and Julie M. will meet to determine how to proceed.

Good News!

We have good news to share! The steeple fund has met the goal of raising \$34,000!

What's our next step? Don Hansen is in contact with three companies to get new bids as the original bid is two years old.

We are still looking at going with copper shingles vs. painted; copper holds up for 100 years while the painted shingles only last 30 years, but nothing has been permanently decided. Once we know the new bid, we will update the congregation.
