PASTOR'S thoughts...

My intent for this article is more informational than inspirational. I want to share a little about "Where We're At" regarding a few areas of our life together as a congregation.

Interim Pastor/New Pastor/Future of FELC

Prior to being slowed down by the COVID-19 pandemic, a few members of the church council and I had shared a few meetings with other congregations in a similar position we are in. They, like us, have experienced a slow but gradual decline in membership and giving which has resulted in the inability to sustain paying for pastoral leadership. The model of "Shared Ministry" is one that helps congregations to work together to share portions of their ministries while still maintaining their own facilities and self identity. Similar informal conversations have been shared between us and some of the MiChiLu (Minnesota, Chisago County, Lutherans) congregations about this as well. Unfortunately most of those connections have been stalled as we are all overwhelmed with how to maintain given the circumstances we are presently facing with COVID-19. I, along with the church council, want you to be well informed about where we're at and hope that you are okay with the progress up to this point.

With all that said, I want to reassure you that I am in a position to walk with you through this process for however long it takes. My contract with you has been extended and expanded to help guide you through this time of transition. The day will come when these talks can resume and hopefully a fruitful partnership will blossom which will provide for a new opportunity for FELC to move forward into an exciting future. As we eventually are allowed to move forward, I would encourage you to be open to the working of the Holy Spirit in this process. Pray, and maybe most importantly listen, for the Spirit's guidance and be willing to step out in faith. Thanks for your patience!

Reopening Task Group

I have put together a task group to help me work through a plan for preparing to safely reopen our building and worship together in person. The members of that task group are: Becky Hulden, Rita Johnson, Arne Lagus, Angie Linngren, Leo Nelson, Wendy Szczepanski, and me. We have drafted a tentative plan which will be attached as part of this newsletter. Keep in mind that our primary objective is to protect the

members and guests of FELC while still providing for the needs of the congregation. Please keep this group's work in your prayers as well.



The challenging part of our work right now is that other churches around us are choosing to reopen as are many other businesses and recreational areas. REOPENING are many outer businesses and restaurant are many of the restaurant a receiving from the CDC, the ELCA and Synod, and other local churches, just doesn't warrant us doing the same. With that, what I wrote last month still

holds true. Worship would be greatly limited, a lot of procedures would need to be enforced, and what I sense is your greatest need, that of socializing with one another, would not be allowed within the building. At this point we all agree it's just not worth it, both on a risk scale and on balance with benefits it will provide. Again, please be patient! We have your best interests at heart.


Just a quick note about worship at present that fit here. On July 5th we will incorporate Holy Communion into the online worship services. We have ordered individually wrapped wafer and grape juice containers that you can use or you can provide your own bread and wine (crackers and juice could also work) in order to participate in that portion of the service. To obtain these containers of bread and juice, either stop at the church office (maybe call to make sure Angie is there or when she will be) or if you are not able to come in, call and we'll make sure these are distributed to you.

Also, we have started a conversation about hosting a drive-up service. We're still in that discussion and will keep you up-to-date if and when such a service might be held. I know from one perspective it sounds pretty easy and straight forward. But from another angle it's much more complicated and the benefits don't seem to outweigh the desire for such a service. We'll keep you posted.

Racial Realities

I feel a deep need to address the racism that persists in me and in our culture. For too long our white dominated and racialized society has

turned away from and ignored the outcries of people of color. It is time for our church and country to admit to and seek to understand the realities of racism. We must, as Drew Hart says in his book Trouble I've Seen, "do a better job of thinking, analyzing, discussing, and ultimately transforming our lives into antiracist and antihierarchical ways of life that conform to the way of Jesus."



Hart's book was suggested by members of FELC **DREW 6.11 HAR** who participated in a book study that I'm assuming

others of you also were a part of. Lisa and I are reading and discussing it together, but we're only about a third of the way through it, but it has been helpful in opening us to see how easy it has been in our lives to simply push this issue aside and pretend it doesn't exist. But it does; racism is a reality for all of us. I have also appreciated watching and listening to the YouTube videos by Emmanuel Acho, Uncomfortable Conversations with a Black Man. I would highly recommend viewing these (there are three out that I know of at this time) and wrestling with what he has to say. We have other friends and family who have been motivated to have similar conversations. My hope is that life will substantially change for the better as we openly and honestly confront the prevailing racism that permeates our society. I don't know how it will happen or even how to enter into the dialog, but may God not let us ever again be satisfied with the way things are or have been.

Overall

I hope these thoughts have been helpful. Please stay safe and protect not only yourself, but your neighbors as well. I look forward to seeing you again, whenever that may be.



It is with great sadness and sorrow that as of July 31st the council has made the very difficult decision to eliminate my position as your Youth Minister and furlough the Choir Director position due to the ongoing difficulties we find our world in during this pandemic. The Youth Minister salary just cannot be sustained and this is the right thing to do in order for our church to continue operating. When it is deemed safe to reconvene for worship and safely sing in a choir I will resume my position as your director if other opportunities have not changed my line of work to support myself and my family. My 16 years here have been an absolute joy. I have made lifelong friends and you have been there for me and my family through very, very difficult times. If I didn't have this particular church family I don't know where I'd be. I will remember all 11 mission trips we took and the experiences gained; winter retreats to Luther Point with 100 White Flags and Swen & Dean; lock ins; 30 Hour Famine; harvest festivals; cantatas; directing ecumenical services; singing in the Lighting Festival Parade; Palm Sunday Breakfasts; Collecting endless gallons of sap/washing endless sap buckets! There is so much more.....I could go on and on. But MOST of all I will greatly miss the daily interactions with all the youth, my choir members, and dear friends. I love you all so very much and hold you dearly in my heart. My experiences here at First Lutheran have shaped and strengthened me in profound ways. You will still see me around because this is my church! I just won't be able to perform the duties I held as your Youth Minister and Choir Director.



First's Reopening Plan

Dear friends,

First's Reopening Task Group has drafted a tentative plan to reopen our building and to prepare for when we can meet, talk and worship together

again face-to-face. We are looking forward to the day when we are able to worship together again! We know that the church is built on relationships, centered on the grace and love of Jesus Christ.

At the same time, it is imperative that First has a plan to safely reopen, and to protect the safety of God's people.

The congregational council reached consensus on this plan. This plan has five stages. The criteria used to develop this plan include:

- Fulfilling the mission to which God has called us which is to gather all people into a life-long relationship with Jesus Christ and to share fully in God's life, love, and work together.
- The safety and well-being of our congregation and community.
- The desire of our congregation to be "together" again.
- The stability and sustainability of the congregation

Data used in developing this reopening plan has come from the Governor's office, the Minnesota Department of Health, the CDC, the synod office and the ELCA, as well as best practices from other large ELCA congregations.

Except for stage 1, we do not yet have specific dates or even triggers for each stage. The timing for shifts from stage to stage will be informed by limitations and dates set by the Governor, the State Department of Health and the Center for Disease Control. So this plan is subject to change.

We also recognize that stepping in to these stages might be a "back and forth" process. Depending on recommendations, we may need to move backwards before moving forward again.

Stage 1

Effective June 1, 2020, the First office will reopen.

- The Ministry Coordinator will work out of the main office
- Other staff will be in the building only as needed
- Volunteers for food ministry in and out as needed
- Otherwise, building still closed and unused areas that have been sanitized will remain sealed off
- Worship will continue being recorded
- Members of our community are encouraged to continue personal preparedness, by washing hands, avoiding touching our faces, etc...
- Physically vulnerable individuals are strongly encouraged to stay home
- Staff will be expected to wear masks when interacting with others in close proximity
- The Reopening Task Group will set expectations and a process for moving to Stage 2
- The Reopening Task Group will continue to consult with local medical experts as we move forward, and the staff will make the decision when to move to stage 2

- All doors are currently locked except the parking lot entrance.
- Hand sanitizer is available at the usher stand.
- All surfaces are washed daily.

First's Reopening Plan

Stage 2

- First's building will reopen on a limited basis.
- While staff may continue working from home, they are also welcome to work in their office space.
- Members of our community are encouraged to continue personal preparedness, by washing hands, avoiding touching our faces, etc...
- Physically vulnerable individuals are strongly encouraged to stay home.
- Staff will be expected to wear masks when interacting with others in close proximity (as per the Dept. of Health recommendations).
- First's office and any areas that are used to record services will be sanitized after use.
- First's Reopening Task Group will set expectations for Stage 3.
- We will continue to consult with local medical experts as we move forward.
- First's congregational council will make the decision when to move to stage 3.

Stage 3

- Face-to face worship resumes (within the limitations of group size & social distancing set by the Governor).
- We will possibly split worship into 2 times for social distancing.
- If you are not feeling well or have a temperature please remain at home.
- All participants will be asked to wear a facial covering which includes the nose and mouth. If you do not have one with you there will be some available at the church door.
- We ask that your facial covering remains on throughout the church service.
- We ask you to use the hand sanitizer stations that will be provided at the outer and inner entry door to the church. Ushers will assist you to locate it.
- We will enter only through the west door entry off the parking lot.
- When entering, please maintain a safe 6-ft distance.

Stage 3 continued.....

- Ushers will ask and advise those entering church to maintain a safe 6-ft distance and will advise all to enter and go directly to a seat location that is a safe distance from other church attendees.
- The pews that will be in use will be clearly indicated.
- It is advised you allow for an empty pew/s between each set of attendees, as indicated by the pews to be in use. Two persons per pew can be safely seated at each end of each pew in use. Do not be offended if you are asked to relocate.
- Hymnals and Bibles will be removed from Sanctuary. Instead, we will print all necessary materials on paper for one-time usage.
- The pew cushions will not be used. If you feel the wooden pew is uncomfortable, please bring your own cushion and then take it home with you.
- Congregational singing would depend on current recommendations from MN Dept. of Health.
- We will receive our offering in plates set by the doors, to avoid passing the plates.
- Communion is served using strict safety protocols.
- No fellowship will occur post the end of the service. Ushers will assist the congregation to leave in a safe manner. You are asked to leave the building and not to congregate outside the building.
- Children are welcome to worship with their families.
- Those who are physically vulnerable to the virus are asked to continue staying at home and worship will be recorded and provided online.
- These services will be recorded (possibly live streamed) and made available as soon as possible for those unable to attend.
- Members of our community are encouraged to continue personal preparedness, by washing hands, avoiding touching our faces, etc...
- Staff will be expected to wear masks when interacting with others in close proximity (as per the Dept. of Health recommendations).
- Other large events in the building may resume (within the limitations of group size & social distancing set by the Governor).
- Food service for these events will not be available yet.
- Weddings and funerals can resume (within the limitations of group size & social distancing set by the Governor).
- The Reopening Task Group will set expectations and process for Stage 4.
- We will continue to consult with local medical experts as we move forward.
- First congregational council will make the decision when to move to stage 4.

First's Reopening Plan

Stage 4

- Large events that include food service may resume
- Sunday morning fellowship may resume
- The Reopening Task Group will set expectations and process for Stage 5
- We will continue to consult with local medical experts as we move forward
- We will continue to seek input from other community organizations (Chisago Lakes School District, other congregations, etc...)
- First congregational council will make the decision when to move to stage 5

Stage 5

First's programming will resume as normal

We are excited to see everyone again. In the midst of this planning, however, we need to acknowledge that the world has changed, and that even when we are past this health crisis, our ministry will have moved into a new stage. And while this creates some uncertainty, and maybe even anxiety, we remain firm in our belief that "nothing can separate us from the love of God in Jesus Christ. Not life, nor death, nor angels, nor rulers..." nor Covid-19, nor quarantine... "nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 8:38-39)

We don't anticipate simply moving back to "what it was," rather we look forward to a new and stronger future.

Thank you for your patience. Thank you for your commitment to the wellbeing of others in the community, and thank you for being the church, wherever you are.



Council Meeting Minutes

Church Council of First Evangelical Lutheran Church

C. Pastor's report - Pastor Dwight

Pastor Rudquist continues to be involved in the weekly taping of the Sunday service. He has made calls to members and attended several virtual meetings: church council, MiChiLu, Reopening task force and synod meetings.

A task force charged with making a plan to Reopen the Church has been organized. They will be deciding what our next phase will look like. Task force members are: Becky Hulden, Leo Nelson, Rita Johnson, Arne Lagus, Angie Linngren, Wendy Szczepanski and Pastor Dwight. The task force wants to be cautious about reopening. Their next virtual meeting is Thursday, June 18. The task force will also look into how to have the annual meeting if we are not meeting in person by August 9.

Pastor Dwight has been meeting virtually with MiChiLu clergy every week. Chisago Lakes has set a tentative reopen date of Sept 13. Some churches are getting pushed to reopen; most are satisfied with the status quo and proceeding cautiously.

Pastor Dwight also prepared Bible studies for Together with Friends. Sunday, June 14 is the first Zoom coffee hour.

Part of the new contract the congregation made with Pastor Dwight is to look beyond the present situation to the next pastor and shared ministry. Pastor Dwight commented on how difficult it is to make plans for the future when Covid 19 makes it so difficult to meet with people. Virtual meetings are not the same as meeting in person. He does not sense there is a rush to survey the congregation about calling another pastor. The council assured him that we are happy with the present situation and appreciate what a good job he is doing in this difficult time.

Pastor Dwight agreed to write a short statement with a list of priorities so the congregation will better understand where we are in the call process. We may not be able to start to work on moving forward in the call process in the short term.

D. Treasurer's Report - Becky

May was a 5 week month. We took in about the same amount as April. Pledged offering and direct deposit are pretty steady. Becky will consult Janelle and Joe to put together a budget for next year. We are somewhat short of our budget.

Steeple repair fund has \$38,000. We need to raise an additional \$24,000 to pay the repair bill.

Program expenses went up. Becky will have Angie look at what expenses went up so we can plan for next year.

E. Garbage Service -

In order to reduce our bill, SRC has been contacted to change our service from 2 trash bins and 2 recycling bins to 1 trash bin and 1 recycling bin per week. The current charge is \$80.14/month and will drop to \$39.67/month.

F. Steeple Update - Wendy

A contract with Central Roofing was signed on June 2, 2020. The property committee is working on how lighting the steeple will be achieved. Labor costs for mounting and running electricity to the lights will be the biggest expense to get the steeple lit.

G. Steeple Fundraiser Ideas -

Some ideas that have been suggested:

- 1. Giving the old green hymnals (no longer in use) to people who donate.
- 2. Giving steeple bookmarks that tell the history of the steeple.
- 3. Getting those who helped out with Maple Sapping to use their Maple Bucks on the Steeple.
- 4. Drive through summer dinner: Brats or pulled pork. Pack the dinner in a bag and bring them to the cars as they pull up.
- 5. Drive through Pie social. Get a piece or a whole pie when you donate.

After discussion the council decided to start with the pie social on Sunday, July 19 from 3:00-4:30. Wendy agreed to head it up. Pies will be baked in disposable pie tins. People can get a whole pie or a piece of pie in a container. We need people to volunteer to make pies. Right now we think we will let people make whatever kind of pie they want to make.

H. Plans for Youth and Education this fall

Pastor Dwight will talk with Michelle and Angie about youth and confirmation. Trinity and Chisago are open to sharing youth ministry, but no one knows what that will look like. Pastor Dwight needs to talk with them more to figure out how it will work.

There are a couple more people interested in joining the confirmation class. Pastor Dwight might set up a Zoom meeting to get the class going again.

The council would like to see Intergenerational Sunday School resumed when we are able to meet in person again.

The council would like to have a goodbye party for Michelle Lynch since the Youth ministry position has been terminated as of July 31 and she is furloughed from the choir position due to Covid 19. She will be able to resume the duties as choir director when it is safe to do so. Becky will set up a Zoom party for the week of July 31. People are invited to send cards to her.

I. Ideas for summer worship

We would like to do a Drive in worship in the parking lot. Our sound system will work outside, but perhaps we can get a radio transmitter to add to the sound system so people tune into a radio station to hear the service. We could bring around communion to each car. We would encourage people to stay in their cars. The council decided to have the task force look into it so we stick to the guidelines for a safe meeting.

We would like to add communion to the July 5 and July 19 services. The council is looking into buying individually prepackaged communion cups and wafers. The individual cups have a small amount of juice sealed in the cup and a wafer also in the package. People could come to church to pick up the individual servings or someone could deliver it to the people who can't pick it up. Another suggestion is people could provide their own wine or juice and bread to eat during the communion part of the service.

J. Ideas for contacting all of our members

After discussing a few different options it was decided that Pastor Dwight will talk to Angie and see if there is a way to do the phone tree that incorporates the prayer partners. Pastor Dwight will do some of the phone calls. We might have few questions to ask: How are you doing? Are you getting groceries? Are you able to participate in the online worship service? If not, how could we help you get it? Do you have any questions about what's going on at church?
