Have you ever seen this story? It made the rounds on email and Facebook a while ago.

A church goer wrote a letter to the editor of his local newspaper, complaining that it made no sense to go to church every Sunday. "I've gone for 30 years now," he wrote, "and in that time I've heard something like 3,000 sermons. But for the life of me, I can't remember a single one of them. So I think I'm wasting my time and the pastors are wasting theirs by giving sermons at all."

This started a real controversy in the "Letters to the Editor" column, much to the delight of the editor. It went on for weeks until someone wrote this clincher:

"I've been married for 30 years now. In that time my wife has cooked some 32,000 meals. But for the life of me, I can't recall the entire menu for a single one of those But I do know this: They all meals. nourished me and gave me the strength I need to do my work. If my wife had not given me those meals, I would be physically dead today. Likewise, if I had not gone to church for nourishment, I would be spiritually dead today!"

Did you know that when Coke a Cola was first being introduced the company gave away huge amounts of "stuff" to vendors - coolers, signs, coasters, etc. in order to make people think of Coke. Between various advertisements and all these other promotional gadgets, it was their intention to make sure each person saw the name Coke at least 76 times each day. Today, in some segments of the world, when you're asked if you want a carbonated beverage they say, "Do you want a Coke?" If you say yes, the next question is, "What kind." Do you think the company's ads worked?

How many times a day do you hear that you are "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people?" (1 Peter 2:9) How many times on the TV do you hear, "Do not let your hearts be troubled?" (John 14:1) Unfortunately we are bombarded with news and information that is constantly telling us to live in fear. We are told that we can only be acceptable if we use this or that product. Life on this side is conditional and quantified. "If you, when you, you should," are but a few of the words we hear over and over.

The good news however is unconditional, it is "you are" because that is what God in Christ has made you. You are God's people, you have received mercy, and you are free to be the people God has created you to be, all because of God's love for us in Jesus.

I promise that's the message you'll hear on Sundays – most of the time at least. Why – because you need to hear it! See you there!!!



#### **Council Meeting Minutes**

Church Council of First Evangelical Lutheran Church June 13 (Sunday), 2021, 10am at church Next meeting: July 11, 2021

#### A. Opening Devotions - Pastor Dwight

#### C. Pastor's Report-Pastor Dwight

Pastor Dwight recorded the final service and led services outdoors and indoors. He attended Zoom meetings with the Reopening Task Group and the synod led Interim Pastors meeting. He met with the Finance committee to write up a proposed budget.

After learning about how slow the office computer is, the council would like to update the office computer by the fall. There are a couple of old computers in the Youth room that need to be disposed of. Pastor will work with Angie to get rid of the old computers and price a new one for the office.

The council is concerned about how to continue Intergenerational Sunday School. Pastor will check with Julie in the hope she will continue to lead it this fall.

Pastor will be gone June 27. Jerry Rhodes will preach and Becky and her husband will lead songs.

We went over the proposed budget and made a couple of changes.

**Motion**: Wendy made a motion, which was seconded by Becky, to adopt the proposed 2021-22 budget with amendments. Motion passed.

#### D. Treasurer's Report – Becky

May had 5 Sundays. In May we were a little above what we need for our

monthly income. Expenses ahead of where we should be. Program expenses above where should be. Becky will go over the deposit sheets to determine where the money that should be in the electronic equipment fund was deposited.

#### E. Transition

The council read through a draft letter to the congregation about working with the Synod to keep Pastor Dwight. It was decided we need to include the timeline and the members of the call committee. The letter will go out in a couple of weeks explaining the transition process.

#### F. Planting Hope Campaign-St. Paul Area Synod (SPAS)

Wendy told about a 3 year fundraising campaign that the St. Paul Synod is launching which involves the following:

- 1. Invite neighbors
- 2. Renewing congregation with synod
- 3. Raise up the next generation of leaders... support for newly ordained pastors to help with their college debt.
- 4. Invest in a transformative project in East St. Paul neighborhood. Like a missionary situation where we are supporting an area where people are unchurched. The details haven't been finalized yet.

Council will revisit it in September when it is more complete.

#### G. Other business-

The Lodge has indicated that they are ready to resume the Book Study that FELC had been holding before the pandemic. We will probably start up in the fall.
