Lent is always a powerful season of the church year for me. As much as I like to focus on the resurrection and the more positive sides of life, Lent is that stark reminder of who I really am and my desperate need for Jesus. I've reminded been of these

realities several times over the years.

On Ash Wednesday, during the imposition of ashes, the words I speak to you as I mark the sign of the cross on your foreheads are always startling to me. It's always a humbling experience as person after person comes forward, and I speak these words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Looking into the faces of people I have come to love and respect and proclaiming these somewhat dark words is challenging.

I recall one time when a youth, 13-14 years old, came forward with his mother, and those words especially grabbed my heart. It wasn't the look in his eyes, but his mother's eyes, that struck me. What was she hearing as I spoke those words to her son: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return?" I can only imagine. But having said those same words to my own children for many years, I have a pretty good idea. Mostly it's a reminder of the frailty of life, the uncertainty of what tomorrow will bring --something that is particularly relevant for us in all we are facing today. But I am also reminded that, as a parent, I often forget the truth that my children are on loan from God, as are we all. And for that matter, so is everything else on this planet.

That notion connects with a second tug at my heart and mind these days. I was recently reminded of a documentary by Tom Shadyac my daughter Emily brought back from a college Januaryterm class. Shadyac directed many major movies like Ace Venture Pet Detective, Bruce Almighty, and The Nutty Professor to name a few. Following a bicycle accident, he had a life-changing experience. He asked himself two questions: "What's wrong with the world?" and, "What will it take to fix it?" In his search for the answer to each of those questions, he talked with scientists, religious leaders, and experts from many other walks of life. In the end (sorry for telling you the punch line) he discovers that the answer to the first question was easy. What's wrong with the world? "I AM" is what he came to realize. Sounds rather dust-like to me J! Sometime it would be interesting to share this video with you--bring some Kleenex.

But is that the end of the story, for this mother, Mr. Shadyac, or for you or me? Hardly! Dust is not the end, death is not the end. The mark I put on that boy's forehead, the mark I will place on yours, is in the shape of a cross. It connects us all with our baptism into Jesus' death and his resurrection. Likewise, the flipside of Shadyac's question sheds some Easter morning light as well. If what's wrong with the world is each of us ("I AM"), the same is true for what is right with the world ("I AM"). You and I are both the problem and the solution! Because we have been crucified with Christ, we get to live with him in the new life that is ours – both now (in making the world right) and forever.

As hard as it is to hear these stark realities of who we are, their very purpose is even more powerful. They bring us to the foot of the cross, so we can look into the eyes of God who says, "I Am your God, I have called you by name and you are mine." And God quickly follows that with directions/instructions/a calling (pick one) to go follow Jesus, look and learn, and be the change the world needs you to be.

May this Lenten and Easter season be a time for you to realize who you are and whose you are. May you find yourself at both the cross and grave - dead and alive along with Jesus. Certainly you need it. So does the world.



Council Meeting Minutes

Church Council of First Evangelical Lutheran Church February 13 (Sunday), 2022, 10:15 am at church

A. Opening Devotions - Dwight

C. Mission Statement, the why - Justin Grimm

Justin was invited by Pastor Dwight to follow up on the "why" conversation presented at a synod workshop attended by members of the council.

Before we can determine what shared ministry will look like we need to determine what our congregation's goals are. What do we feel God is leading us to do?

Justin discussed some programs offered by the synod and asked some questions about our history. He suggested we take the next 6 months to listen to members of the congregation to determine who we are and what God is calling us to do.

The council decided to have Justin come and train interested members of the congregation in spiritual listening so we can determine our goals prior to pursuing shared ministry.

D. Pastor's Report - Pastor Dwight

Pastor Dwight had several in person and phone visits this month. He also officiated for two non member funerals.

Pastor Dwight will connect with Craig to set up staff performance reviews. He needs to determine if there is paperwork that needs to be done.

Evening Lent services will be held in person starting with Ash Wednesday, March 2. It will be a simple service incorporating sharing thoughts about the readings without a sermon. The services will not be recorded.

Confirmation students will come in early to meet in person prior to the Lent service.

Pastor Dwight will organize a meeting for the Reopening Task group to determine when it is safe to have fellowship time after the service.

E. Treasurer's Report - Becky

January had 5 weeks. Our offering for January was \$3000 over budget.

We should be at 58% of our budget. Our Income is at 66% and Expenses are at 55%.

PPP loan forgiveness paperwork received back on February 8, 2022. We have successfully completed two rounds of this loan program.

We have \$41,725 available to for property projects

F. Road Sign(s) - Wendy

Wendy found out the county makes the sign and installs them. The charge is \$350 for each sign. It was decided to table the decision for a month so council members can look at signs in the county and think about what they want and where to have the sign placed.

G. Basement Water

The property committee has not received any replies for estimates for the gutter work.

The property committee will put together a proposal to present to the congregation so we know how much money will be needed for concrete work, gutters, caulking and landscaping.

A Motion by Rose, seconded by Craig, to have a congregation meeting after church on March 20 to approve a proposal to have work done to prevent water from coming in the basement. Motion carried.
