
Saturday, March 11th 9:00am - 2:00pm

# C. Pastor's Report - Pastor Dwight

Pastor Dwight had many in person visits with people. He led worship at the Lodge on January 25. He participated in the Vision Task Force and Building Task Force. He led choir rehearsals.

Pastor signed us up for Feed my Starving Children so he will get notification when the time slots are open.

Pastor Dwight will be out of town March 8-11. Becky will lead the music for the Lenten service.

Pastor Dwight will lead an Ash Wednesday service at The Lodge on February 22 at 1:30.

# D. Treasurer's Report - Becky

Our income in January (\$9942.75) is a little less than adequate for our budget. Our income (59%) and expenses (54%) are right on according to our budget. We have \$1679.64 more in our accounts than last month.

The council would like the auditing committee to meet quarterly. Pastor Dwight will set up a meeting to go over the tasks the committee needs to perform.

Kathy motioned, Becky seconded, that Lent offering be designated for Feed my Starving Children. Motion passed.

Wendy made a motion, Craig seconded, that we donate \$25 to the Baptist church for expenses related to the TF teacher's luncheon held on February 3. The money will come out of line item 6435. Motion passed.

## E. Property committee projects

The council reviewed the property projects proposed by the Property Committee.

Finishing up the landscaping was already approved by the congregation so it will be completed this spring or summer.

The council determined that replacing the boiler for the Sunday School area is the most important project. The council directs the property committee to get 3 bids on a new boiler. Once the bids are completed we will have a congregational meeting.

Craig motioned, second by Becky, that we remodel the bathrooms on the east end of fellowship hall and replace the two exterior doors on the north side of the church door in the kitchen and the door on the NE corner) approving up to \$2500 to come out of line 3040 (property projects). Motion passed.

The council also directs the Property Committee to secure a second bid on repaying the parking lot.

# F. Vision Group -

The group met last week. Steve and Jeanie Jensen were here to share about their church's shared ministry journey. The Vision Task Force plans to connect with local pastors and community leaders to find out how First is viewed by the community. The Vision Task Force will meet every two weeks so we continue to move forward on our Shared Ministry journey. The next meeting is February 21 from 5:00-7:00. Pastor Dwight and Don Hansen will attend Peace Lutheran's council meeting (Dresser church) on Thursday to begin the conversation with them about shared ministry.

#### G. New business

Festival Theatre asked to rent space for rehearsal during the last 3 weeks in July from noon to 9 PM. Wendy will connect with them about using the fellowship hall. We will ask that they be flexible in case we need to have a funeral.

March is MNFood Share month. This is a yearly food and fund-raising drive. In 2022, we served between 130-170 families each month here in the Chisago Lakes community. That includes between 300-400 people monthly. We have family sizes that range from a household of 1 to

a household of 11. We served 157 new families in 2022 alone. Overall the need for food shelves has gone up by 51% in the last decade. We are expecting another large rise in families needing support in the upcoming months due to the ending Covid-19 SNAP benefits in March.

We distributed 153,000 pounds of food throughout 2022. Community donations totaled 133,474 pounds! That means that the majority of the food we distribute comes from local food drives and the support of local churches and businesses. Other items we get come from Second Harvest Heartland. Our budget for purchasing comes from local financial donations. All of the money donated to the Family Pathways Chisago Lakes Food Shelf stays at our facility. Did you know we can turn \$1 into \$7 worth of food and \$10 can feed a family of 4 for one week?

We also run the local backpack programs, serving all 5 of our schools in the Chisago Lakes School District. We have volunteers that pack over 50 bags of food and deliver them to the various schools. These bags of food ensure that those students have something to eat over the weekend. They contain 3-5 pounds of food each and include breakfast, lunch and dinner items. All families that qualify for free/ reduced lunches also qualify for this program and the sign ups can be found in the weekly principal emails. The backpack program bags include items like chicken noodle soup, peanut butter, individual cereals, single serve oatmeal packages, cans of fruit and vegetables, canned tuna or chicken and snacks.

Some of the items that the food shelf is always in need of are: peanut butter, egg noodles, baked beans, chunky soups, Ramen noodles. flavored crackers, spaghetti sauce, butter, sliced cheese, laundry and dishwasher soaps, cleaning products and personal hygiene items.
