First Things



Not often does this happen, but I'm stumped. I want to be able to write something profound in light of all of what is going on right now in the world, but I just don't quite have the words. I have a lot of feelings about people's perspective on the pandemic and vaccinations and how best to live our lives. I'm sure you do as well. I am also overwhelmed and unsure of how to feel or think or respond to the recent shootings, the prospect of a verdict from the Derek Chauvin trial, and the perpetual news about immigration.

One comment has really struck me as I watched the news about the shooting of Daunte Wright. I've always been very proud to be from Minnesota. I've had the fortune to travel to much of the country and experience life in a lot of other states. My perspective and general conclusion is that Minnesota is a great place to live, and it is. But I've come to learn that MN is a great place to live - IF YOU'RE WHITE. I realize that I have been much more sheltered from the reality that my black brothers and sisters live with on a daily basis. I'm guessing that's true for many of us. I want this to change! I want MN to be a great place to live for everyone. I want education, healthcare, housing, and the legal system to be as favorable to blacks and other people of color as they are to me.

Since the death of George Floyd, some of my family (daughters, nieces, a sister-in-law) have been intentional about having conversations about "justice" issues. I'm very thankful for Zoom that we can connect for these discussions. We've read various books and articles and shared our thoughts about what we've read and what's happening in the world. Emmanuel Acho, the son of Nigerian immigrant parents, who went on to play for the Philadelphia Eagles in the NFL, has created some videos entitled "Uncomfortable Conversations with a Black Man." I'm now reading his book by the same title. What continues to strike me, much like my earlier comment about MN, is the reality of "systemic racism." It has been way too easy for me to sit back in the comfort of my home, my life, and ignore how biased the systems are in my favor, just because of my skin color. Acho writes, "You've likely spent your whole life enjoying the fruits of systemic racism and never having to directly engage with its fallout." He's right, at least for me. He goes on to say,

you must not be afraid to take the first step. We will fail when we fail to try.

"NO ONE CAN fight systemic racism To bring about change, alone. It's too big and in too many areas. On the flip side, that means there are a million ways to help. ... Dismantling systemic racism is nothing short of dismantling white supremacy. It's going to take a herculean effort by all of us to tear it down." I think he's right on all fronts and I want to be part of how to help.

> I'm guessing that not every one of you who is reading this agrees with me or sees

things even remotely the same. My hope is that somehow, sometime in the near future, we too can have some uncomfortable conversations which might enlighten us and to help us see our role in making this world a better place ... for all! I have to believe that's what Jesus died for! Please commit with me to not sit back, but to work through these issues together.

Council Meeting Minutes

C. Pastor's Report - Pastor Dwight

It is good to be back together worshipping outside. The fundraising breakfast was fun. Pastor Dwight appreciates all the work Angie did to put together all the extra services for Lent and Holy Week.

Pastor Dwight has met with the reopening task force via Zoom. The ReOpening Task Force will start meeting twice a month to determine what it will look like for services to be held indoors. Currently small groups could meet indoors but there would be no singing or congregation responses. Right now outside worship with congregation responses and singing seems like a better way to worship.

During the last month Pastor Dwight had Zoom meetings with the confirmation class, MiChiLu Pastors, Synod Interim pastors and the congregation coffee hour. He also had phone visits with some members.

Pastor Dwight will coordinate with Angie, Tim and Julie to determine a list of projects that need to be done around church in May. Angie will coordinate the jobs so people can call to see what projects need to be done.

D. Treasurer's Report - Becky

Two undesignated savings accounts \$10,320 and miscellaneous savings at \$9,000.

Motion: Rose made a motion to move \$1000 from account 3235 (Klinke fund) to Samaritan fund checking account. Wendy seconded. Motion passed.

The check from Jeanne Fick for the steeple lighting and the check from Alton Berg and Edith Johnson's estate will be deposited into the Klinke fund.

In March our income was adequate for our budget.

We got a second PPP loan designed to cover our loss of income for the 2020-21 fiscal year.

After discussion the council decided to ask the Buildings and Grounds Committee to submit a prioritized list of projects that need to be done for the structure of the building. We know there is a problem with water getting into the basement.

Becky reported that expenses for software and IT was twice what was budgeted. First pays a monthly fee for Zoom calls which weren't necessary when we could meet together. Editing software needed for production of the services was purchased.

Garbage removal expense was dropped from \$80 to \$45 per month.

The church signed a new lease for copier/printer which will reduce the expenses by half.

Building and maintenance/ supplies shows spent \$3000 from account 6610. Janelle will print the report from church so Becky can examine it.

E. Production equipment for church service -

Production equipment (account 3040) has \$4460.62 We still need about \$3700 to pay for the equipment needed to record our services.

After discussion the council decided to wait until next month to determine if we need additional fundraisers or if we should use some of the money in our account to pay for the balance needed for the production equipment.

F. Parish Nurse Update -

Becky will propose a job description for the parish nurse soon.

She is taking a class about living well with chronic conditions. After completing the class Becky will be able to teach the class online or over the phone. She hopes to have a class available in August or September.

Becky has contacted most of the people eligible to get the Covid-19 vaccine and discovered most people have been vaccinated.

G. Annual Meeting -

The annual meeting will be August 8, right after the church service.

H. Child Protection Policy - Wendy

Wendy has read through different policies from our insurance company and ones she found online. She suggested our policy also include vulnerable adults.

Pastor Dwight, Wendy, Rose and Becky will be part of the small group to look over policies and put together a Child/Vulnerable adult Protection Policy for First. Wendy will check with some other members of the congregation to see if they would like to be on the task force. The group will meet via Zoom in the next few weeks.
