In the Gospel of John, we hear that Mary Magdalene weeps at the empty tomb of Jesus. The lens she still sees through is one of tragedy. Jesus has died, and now it appears that someone has gone so far as to steal his body. I can imagine she might have thought enemies of Jesus had done this, the same ones who had wanted to squelch his voice and end his rabble rousing amongst the people. Even as she comes face to face with two mysterious figures (aka angels) it still isn't making sense to her. As she turns there is a man standing there, it's Jesus, but in her grief and preconceived expectations, she doesn't recognize him. Jesus then says to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?"



"Whom are you looking for?" Or as an Aramaic translation says, "Who do you want?" Both are great and interesting questions for us aren't they? Of all the images or versions of Jesus that are out there, which one do you believe? For Mary it could have been the Jesus who turned water into wine or healed lepers and raised Lazarus from the dead. It could have been the Jesus she saw only a week before riding into Jerusalem to a crowd shouting "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord - the King of Israel!" Or she could be thinking of Jesus who stooped before his disciples and washed their feet. Which of these Jesus' was she crying for? Who did she want?

Who do you want? Who do you want Jesus to be for you? What are you looking for from Jesus? Those are again interesting questions. I hope you can recognize that different people see and want Jesus to be various things for them. Some want Jesus to be their friend or a healer or teacher. Yet some want that for them, but they want Jesus to be a judge or sifter of the wheat. They want Jesus to separate the sheep from the goats, even though I don't think that is a clear message from that story. Can you see how complicated at times that question can be?

What I am grateful for is that I believe Jesus to be more than all of what we can imagine. Jesus is beyond just a teacher, healer, or friend. Jesus is both fully human and fully God! Jesus is the one who has come not to condemn the world, but to save it.

My hope is that we can be honest about the Jesus we are looking for and also recognize that too often we limit who Jesus is for those around us. Take some time to contemplate who you are looking for and what you want from Jesus. And think also about how you perceive others might answer those questions. In the end it might help to step back and just be thankful that Jesus is so much more, that God's love for us in Jesus brings us all, wholeness and healing and eternal life! For all that I say, "Thanks be to God! AMEN!"

C. Pastor's Report - Pastor Dwight

Pastor Dwight presided over many worship services due to Lent and Holy Week. We had some parishioners from the Methodist church join our Holy Week services.

There are 6 people signed up for Feed my Starving Children on April 20.

The \$1147 collected during the Lent services will be given to Feed My Starving Children.

D. Treasurer's Report - Becky

Our income in March (\$9277) is less than adequate for our budget for the fourth month in a row. Our income (76%) and expenses (73%) are right on according to our budget (which should be at 75%). We gained \$6500 since last month, mostly because of memorials for Leo Nelson.

E. Property committee projects

Additional bids for a boiler for the Sunday school area were received. The property committee will review the bids and compare them in order to make a decision on higher efficiency boiler and water heater.

A Special Congregational meeting will be held May 21 to discuss the boiler purchase and revised mission statement.

The committee will also continue with the bathroom remodeling project.

F. Vision Group -

The Vision Group is meeting tomorrow morning with Justin and Rolf from the Synod so we can determine our options for moving forward with the Shared Ministry. Peace in Dresser has declined the possibility of shared ministry.

G. Prayer shawl ministry

Becky is starting a Prayer Shawl ministry at First Lutheran. Interested knitters and crocheters will knit or crochet shawls to be given to someone who needs to feel God's presence, like someone with a terminal illness or death in the family. Donated shawls will be blessed at the monthly craft day at church. Angie is making card stock tags to say who made them, who they are for and they are blessed. Becky will write an article for the newsletter.
