651-465-5265 www.tflutheran.org Beginning on September 10th we will be switching from the Revised Common Lectionary to the <u>Narrative Lectionary</u>. On Sundays from September through May this year the scriptural texts follow the sweep of the biblical story, from Creation through the early Christian church. The

texts show the breadth and variety of voices within Scripture. They invite you to hear the stories of Abraham and Sarah, Moses and the prophets, Jesus, and Paul. The hope is that in listening to the many different voices within Scripture you will grow in your overall appreciation and knowledge of the Biblical story as well as enrich your life of faith.

This lectionary was started back in 2010 by a few professors at Luther Seminary in St. Paul along with the consultation of pastors throughout the church. The texts that are selected lend themselves well to the proclamation of what God is doing. The stories tell of hope and disappointment, suffering and redemption. In all these varied contexts, we find God dealing with the complexities of human life. This is a four year cycle of stories with a focus on a different Gospel each year. This year we will discover the richness and distinctive character of Mark's Gospel and his account of the life of Jesus.

The Church Year also helped shape the flow of the Narrative Lectionary. Old Testament readings move through the story of God's dealings with Israel and culminate in Advent with the prophets who speak of longing and hope. Readings from the Gospels fit the movement from Christmas and Epiphany to the Transfiguration, Ash Wednesday, Holy Week and Easter. Selections from the book of Acts and Paul's letters trace the outward movement of the resurrection message, culminating on Pentecost with readings focusing on the Spirit.

The two biggest changes you will notice will be that there may be only one reading each week (often a Psalm or other responsive reading will be included) and that up until Advent, there will be no Gospel reading. Trust that Jesus shines throughout the entire Bible and we will discover together many connections to Jesus from those 1st Testament stories. The hope is that the overall biblical story becomes more familiar to you and you are able to speak more fluently the first language of our faith.

Apple Pie Crescents

Ingredients

- 1 small Granny Smith Apple, peeled, cored, cut into 8 (1/2 inch) slices
- 3 Tbsp butter, melted
- 1 can (8oz) Pillsbury Original Crescent Rolls (8 count)
- 1/3 cup packed brown sugar
- 1 tsp apple pie spice

Steps

- 1. Heat oven to 375. Line cookie sheet with parchment paper or grease cookie sheet.
- 2. In a small bowl, toss apple slices in 1 Tbsp melted butter; set aside. Separate dough into 8 triangles.
- 3. In small bowl, mix brown sugar and apple pie spice. Divide mixture evenly among triangles. Top each triangle with one apple slice. Starting at short side of each triangle, wrap dough around apple. Place on cookie sheet. Brush with remaining 2 Tbsp melted butter.
- 4. Bake for 10-12 minutes or until crescents are deep golden brown and apples are softened. Cool 5 minutes before serving.
